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RE: TRANSMITTAL OF 2022 PERFORMANCE SCORECARD

Dear Secretary Dar and Administrator Serafica,

This is to formally transmit the Charter Statement and Strategy Map (*Annex A*), and 2022 Performance Scorecard (*Annex B*) of SRA. The same is to be posted in SRA's website, in accordance with Section 43 of GCG Memorandum Circular (M.C.) No. 2012-07.<sup>1</sup>

The SRA's proposed Charter Statement and Strategy Map submitted through its letter dated 26 October 2021² were <u>RETAINED</u> while the Performance Scorecard was <u>MODIFIED</u> based on the discussions made during the online technical panel meeting (TPM) held on 21 December 2021 via Microsoft Teams and evaluation of supporting documents submitted through its letter dated 21 January 2022.³

We take this opportunity to remind SRA that Item 5 of GCG M.C. No. 2017-02<sup>4</sup> mandates GOCCs to submit Quarterly Monitoring Reports and upload the same in the GOCC's website within thirty (30) calendar days from the close of each quarter. SRA is thus requested to submit its revised Quarterly Targets based on the attached Scorecard upon submission of its Quarterly Monitoring Report for 2022.

Finally, under GCG M.C. No. 2017-02, GOCCs can no longer renegotiate the targets set in their Performance Scorecards for the current year. Thus, any request for modification in the 2022 Performance Scorecard will instead be considered during the validation of the reported annual accomplishments.

#### MISSION

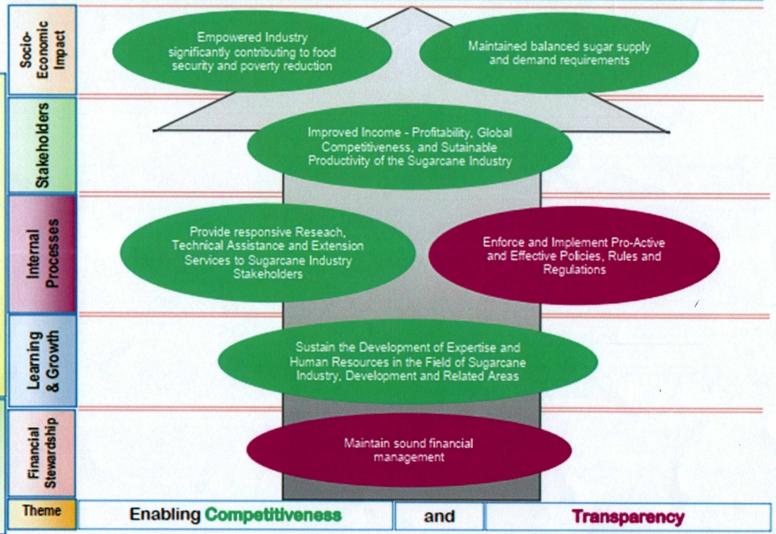
